UNITED NATIONS COVENTION ON THE RIGHTS of the CHILD

ARTICLE 28

Every child has the right to an education. Discipline in school should respect children's dignity. Young people should be encouraged to reach the highest level of education of which they are capable.

ARTICLE 29

Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.

What is a home-school agreement?

A home-school agreement explains the schools aims and values, will make clear the responsibilities of the school, your responsibilities as a parent/carers, and what the school expects of their pupils. All schools have a home-school agreement

Why are home-school agreements important?

Children achieve more when schools and parents work together. Home-school agreements will help to achieve this, as your support and encouragement are very important if your child is to make the most of school.

School agrees to:

- Provide a safe, happy and stimulating learning environment for your child;
- Provide a broad and balanced curriculum which challenges your child to reach their potential;
- Provide homework that supports the learning of your child on a regular basis;
- Keep you informed about your child's curriculum, progress and behaviour;
- Work together in partnership with you for the benefit of your child;
- To be open and welcoming, offer opportunities for you to become involved in the life of the school and respond to your questions and concerns as quickly as possible;;
- Encourage your child to show friendship and respect for others and to follow the schools behaviour policy, ensuring a safe environment for all;
- Allow children safe and secure use of the internet and provide a knowledge and understanding of its dangers.

The School Rules

- Follow instructions;
- Keep hands, feet and other objects to yourself;
- Be kind;
- Look after everyone's property, including the school's;
- Be a good listener.

Family agrees to:

- Ensure that my child attends school each day on time;
- Make sure that my child is suitably dressed for school and has PE kit available;

- Attend Parent Consultation appointments to discuss my child's progress;
