SEND Jargon Buster

There are lots of technical words and phrases used in school. Here are some of those and their definitions:

Annual Review—a review of a child's EHC Plan at least every 12 months

ADHD—Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

ASD—Autistic Spectrum Disorder

EHCP—Education, Health and Care Plan

Graduated Approach—a process to assess, plan, do, review provision for SEND

HI—Hearing Impairment

LA—Local Authority

Local Offer—Information about the provision that the LA expects to be available in its area for children and young people with SEND

MLD—Moderate learning difficulties

MP—My Plan

MP+ - My Plan +

My Profile—Information sheet completed by all children in school every year

Outcome—what we want to achieve in a set time

SaLT—Speech and Language Therapist

SEMH—Social, Emotional and Mental Health difficulties

SEND—Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

SEND Information Report—information about the provision for pupils with SEND in school

SEND Policy—policy setting out the values, vision and aims of the schools SEND arrangements

SENDCo—Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Co-ordinator, the person in school who co-ordinates the provision for children with SEND.

Sensory Room—A space which uses special lighting, music, and objects to creating a calm environment or develop certain senses.

SLCN—Speech, Language and Communication Needs

SLD—Severe learning difficulties

Special School—A school that is specifically organised to make special educational provision for pupils with SEN

SpLD—Specific Learning Difficulties e.g. dyslexia

Transition—moving between different phases of education
